MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

In a fiscal year like 2020 has been, it would be easy to enumerate the many challenges that BCI has faced, but instead, I'd like to share with you the triumphs.

Like the rest of the world, mid-March delivered many surprises to BCI. Up until then, we were moving through what was seemingly an expected year and enjoying nice progress toward our multi-year strategy to establish the employment continuum, including the continued expansion of our Skills Center. Immediately, I began to see the best of what BCI is and has always been...resilient, forward-thinking and committed.

Resilient

The staff stepped up overnight to assess the risks to everyone in our BCI community and to implement new safety protocols. In a very short time frame, physical production and all employee spaces were adapted and safety protocols implemented. In an environment where familiarity and predictability are so important to many of our employees, team members were now greeted by masked supervisors and a temperature check, followed by safety training and adaptations in almost everything that happens all day long. And yet, the enthusiasm of every BCI employee has remained and even strengthened. In these months, teamwork and positive attitudes have continued to shine.

Forward Thinking

While we are reacting to the new challenges of operating in the midst of a pandemic, our vision of the future is unchanged. We have continued to keep our packaging operations up and running, which has allowed us to ensure that BCI will be here for our employees to return to when it is safe for all. The staff created virtual learning opportunities so that all BCI team members could keep their skills sharp in the meantime, and efforts were doubled to keep Skills Center classes going.

Committed

We have always taken seriously our mission to provide adults with developmental disabilities meaningful work, but we could have never predicted exactly how important the work of the BCI team would be. During the pandemic, BCI has continued our long partnerships with our packaging customers. Now striving to meet new levels of demand, the team has worked tirelessly to package and assemble many essential products including Lysol wipes, household cleaning items, and surgical curtains that have been shipped all over the country. Our employee's commitment to

continue to be part of our larger community and play an outsized role has been inspiring and has given a whole new meaning to fulfillment that can be found in a job.



COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The COVID-19 pandemic began affecting our organization on March 16, 2020, when employees served under Organizational Employment Services (OES) were requested to stay home with pay. In an effort to keep them engaged and socially connected, we initiated a schedule of online training and virtual "socials".

Without the adults with disabilities at work, BCI Packaging operated at 25% capacity from March through May. Furthermore, the Skills Center was unable to conduct classes, annual fundraising events were cancelled, and the organization incurred increased operational costs to create a safe return-to-work environment. Changes were made at all facilities to meet CDC guidelines. Production lines were spaced further apart, and additional break and lunch times were added to allow proper social distancing. We added plexiglass shields on the lunch room and production tables, increased cleaning schedules and supplies, checked temperatures, and required masks.

From May 4 to June 15, employees with disabilities were welcomed back to work in waves, restoring productivity to fulfill strong demand from our valued customers. As of June 30, BCI had 364 of its total employees back, of which 256 (286 in 2019) were adults with disabilities.






