Custodial Program

Wentzville School District

This six-week course equips students with disabilities with the vocational and soft skills necessary to secure competitive integrated employment with the Wentzville School District. In addition to almost all of the city of Wentzville, the district serves all of Lake St. Louis, the St. Charles County portion of Foristell, and portions of Dardenne Prairie, Flint Hill, Josephville, and O'Fallon. It is among Missouri's fastest-growing school districts.

- » Students prepared for part-time/full-time/substitute Custodian positions, with a starting wage of \$15/hour
- » Students train four hours a day (Monday-Friday from 2:30-6:30p), where they learn to clean classrooms, restrooms, offices, common areas, and other high-touch areas
- » Students also learn soft skills (communication, teamwork, expectations, personal finance) I hour a day
- » Students train at an elementary, middle, and high school to see which environment is the best fit
- » Upon hiring, students can choose the available worksite that is most convenient for them
- » Training is accredited by the Missouri Department of Higher Education



- » County or state funding typically covers tuition costs—scholarship funds may also be available
- » Students must successfully complete the course and meet all pre-hiring requirements to earn a job offer
